DIRECTIONS.

In the Programme the Courses are Referred to as Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4.

- No. 1 COURSE is—From near the wharves round a buoy off the Koro Koro, thence to and round a buoy over the wreck of the Willie McLaren, thence to and round a buoy or flag-ship off the Wharf. Yachts to keep on town side of both Soames and Ward Islands. Twice round. This course for a southerlywind. For a northerly wind, the first buoy to be rounded will be the Willie McLaren buoy; then the Koro Koro buoy, and the flag-ship or buoy off the Wharf. Twice round. Distance about 31 miles.
- No. 2 COURSE is—Round buoy off Halswell Point, and Club buoy, north of Ngahauranga. Distance about 20 miles, twice round.
- No. 3 COURSE is—Round buoy off Point Jerningham, and Club buoy off Kaiwarra. Distance about nine miles, twice round.
- No. 4 COURSE is—Round buoy off Point Jerningham and Hinemoa's or Stella's buoy, off Railway Wharf.
- (a) For all sailing races, in northerly winds, the buoys used to mark the course are to be kept on the port side; and in southerly winds, on the starboard side of the yacht or boat when rounding.
- (b) In completing once round the course, or more than once as the case may be, and in finishing races, competitors will leave the coal hulk moored off the Queen's Wharf, and which has the Club's burgee flying on it, on the port hand in northerly winds, and on the starboard hand in southerly winds. But should the hulk be moved, the flag will be placed on the southernmost buoy.
- (c) The starter will fire a gun at 9 a.m., on Anniversary Day, and this will indicate to competitors that the Committee considers the weather sufficiently favourable to begin the programme. Should the weather not be favourable the decision of the Committee will be posted in the Empire Hotel. Should the weather be fine overhead, the water sports and side-show programme will be proceeded with.
- (d) For all events two to start or no race; three to start or no second prize, unless otherwise specified.
- (e) The Committee reserves the right to make deductions from the advertised prize money should funds be short.
