To start at 10.30 a.m. Once round No. 1 Course. Open to all Yachts. of 36ft, L.R. and over.

Prizes-First, £5; second, £2/10/-: third, £1.

#### No. 2. Third-Class Yachts (Handicap).

To start at 10.45 a.m. Once round No. 3 Course. Open to all Yachts of 25ft. L.R. and under.

#### No. 3. Second-Class Yachts (Rating).

To start at 11 a.m. Once round No. 2 Course. Open to all Yachtsover 25ft. L.R. and under 36ft. L.R.

#### No. 13. Coal Hulks' Boats, Sailing (Handicap)

To start at 3.45 p.m. Twice round No. 4 Course.

Prizes-£3 added to Sweepstake.

#### No. 14. Naval Cutter Race, Sailing (Scratch).

To start at 3.45 p.m. Twice round No. 4 Course.

Prizes-First, £4 and Trophy; second, £1.

#### No. 15. Oil and Steam Launches (Handicap).

Open to Boats of P.N. Motor Boat Club over 25ft, over all. To start at 4 p.m. Twice round No. 4 Course.

Prizes-First, Trophy; second, Trophy.

#### 16. Oil and Steam Launches (Handicap).

Open to Boats of P.N. Motor Boat Club under 25ft. over all. To start at 4 p.m. Twice round No. 4 Course,

### DIRECTIONS, &c. 10002 .0 .01

#### COURSES.

a Course. Open to all Yachts

The Starting and Finishing Line shall be a Line from South end of Club House to a Club Buoy with Flag on.

- No. I Course is from Starting Line to and round Pinnacles Buoy, thence to and round Koro Koro Buoy, and back to Starting Line.
- No. 2 Course is from Starting Line to and round Hope Shoal Buoy, thence to and round Koro Koro Buoy, and back to Starting Line.
- No. 3 Course is from Starting Line to and round Halswell Buoy, thence to and round Koro Koro Buoy, and back to Starting Line.
- No. 4 Course is from Starting Line to and round Man-of-War Buoy, thence to and round Kaiwarra Buoy, and back to Starting Line.

The above Courses are for Northerly Wind. If Southerly Wind, reverse Course.

If Northerly Wind, ALL BUOYS are to be rounded leaving same on PORT SIDE, and in Southerly Wind, ALL BUOYS are to be rounded leaving same on STARBOARD SIDE.

In all races, three to start or no second prize, five to start or no third prize, subject to Sailing Rule 28.

#### STARTING OF SECOND RACES.

If all the boats in the first race of any class are not across the finishing line before the starting time of the second race, it shall be optional for the Sub-Committee of the day to start or postpone the race.

In the event of a shift in the wind, boats will keep the course on which they start.

In all races boats to cross finishing line not later than 7 p.m.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR STARTING, &c.

A gun will be fired and a "Blue Peter" hoisted five minutes before the start of each race, and upon the expiry of the five minutes the ffag will be lowered and the gun fired again, which shall be the signal to start. Should any boat be over the line before the time, her recall flag will be hoisted as a recall signal, and will be lowered as a signal to start after such boat has recrossed the starting line.

#### ENTRANCE FEES.

For First, Second, and Third-Class Yachts and Launches, 5 per cent. total prize money.

For Open Boats (10ft. and under), Half-Decked Boats (14ft. and under), 2/6 each race.

For Ships' Boats, Coal Hulks' Boats, and Naval Cutters, FREE.

Entries close with the Secretary, at the Club House, Thorndon Esplanade, on Tuesday, 15th January, 1907, at 9 p.m.
