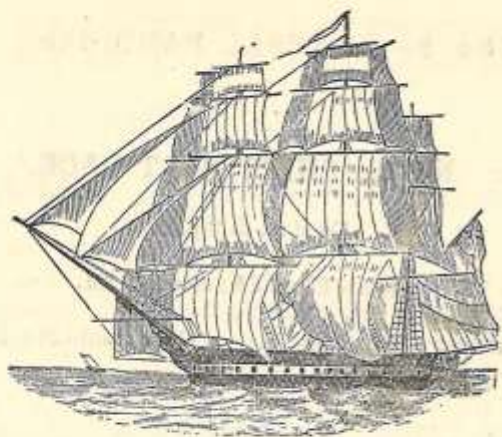

DIRECTIONS.

In the Programme the Courses are referred to as Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4.

- No. 1 COURSE** is—From south end of Queen's Wharf thence to and round Club buoy off Koro Koro, thence to and round Club buoy south end of Worsler Bay, thence to and round flag mark off Wharf. Yachts must keep on town side of both Soames and Ward Islands. Reverse course in northerly wind.
- No. 2 COURSE** is—From south end of Queen's Wharf thence to and round Club buoy off Koro Koro, thence to and round buoy on Hope Shoal off Ward Island, thence to and round flag mark off wharf. Yachts must keep on town side of Soames Island. Reverse course in northerly wind.
- No. 3 COURSE** is—From south end of Queen's Wharf thence to and round Club buoy off Koro Koro, thence to and round buoy off Point Halswell, thence to and round flag mark off Wharf. Reverse course in northerly wind.
- No. 4 COURSE** is—From south end of Queen's Wharf thence to and round buoy off Kaiwarra, thence to and round buoy off Point Jerningham. Reverse course in northerly wind.

(a) For all sailing races, in northerly winds, the buoys used to mark the course are to be kept on the *port side*; and in southerly winds, on the *starboard side* of the yacht or boat when rounding,

(b) In completing once round the course, competitors will leave the coal hulk or buoy moored off the Queen's Wharf, and which has the Club's burgee flying on it, on the port-hand in northerly winds, and on the starboard-hand in southerly winds. But should the hulk be moved, the flag will be placed on the southermost buoy. All finishes must be across the starting line.

(c) The starter will fire a gun at 9 a.m. on Anniversary Day, and this will indicate to competitors that the Committee considers the weather sufficiently favourable to begin the programme. Should the weather not be favourable, the decision of the Committee will be posted in the Empire Hotel.

(d) For all events two to start or no race; three to start or no second prize; five to start or no third prize.

(e) The Committee reserve the right to make deductions from the advertised prize money should funds be short.

(f) When races are fixed to start at the hour, the starting gun will be fired at the first stroke of the hour. For all other races the starting gun will be fired at the first stroke of the chimes.

(g) The Committee reserve to themselves the right to place fair-play men on all or any yacht.

(h) In the event of a shift in the wind, boats will keep the course on which they start.

(i) All protests to be made in accordance with the Club rules, and to be accompanied by the sum of Twenty Shillings, which will be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous.

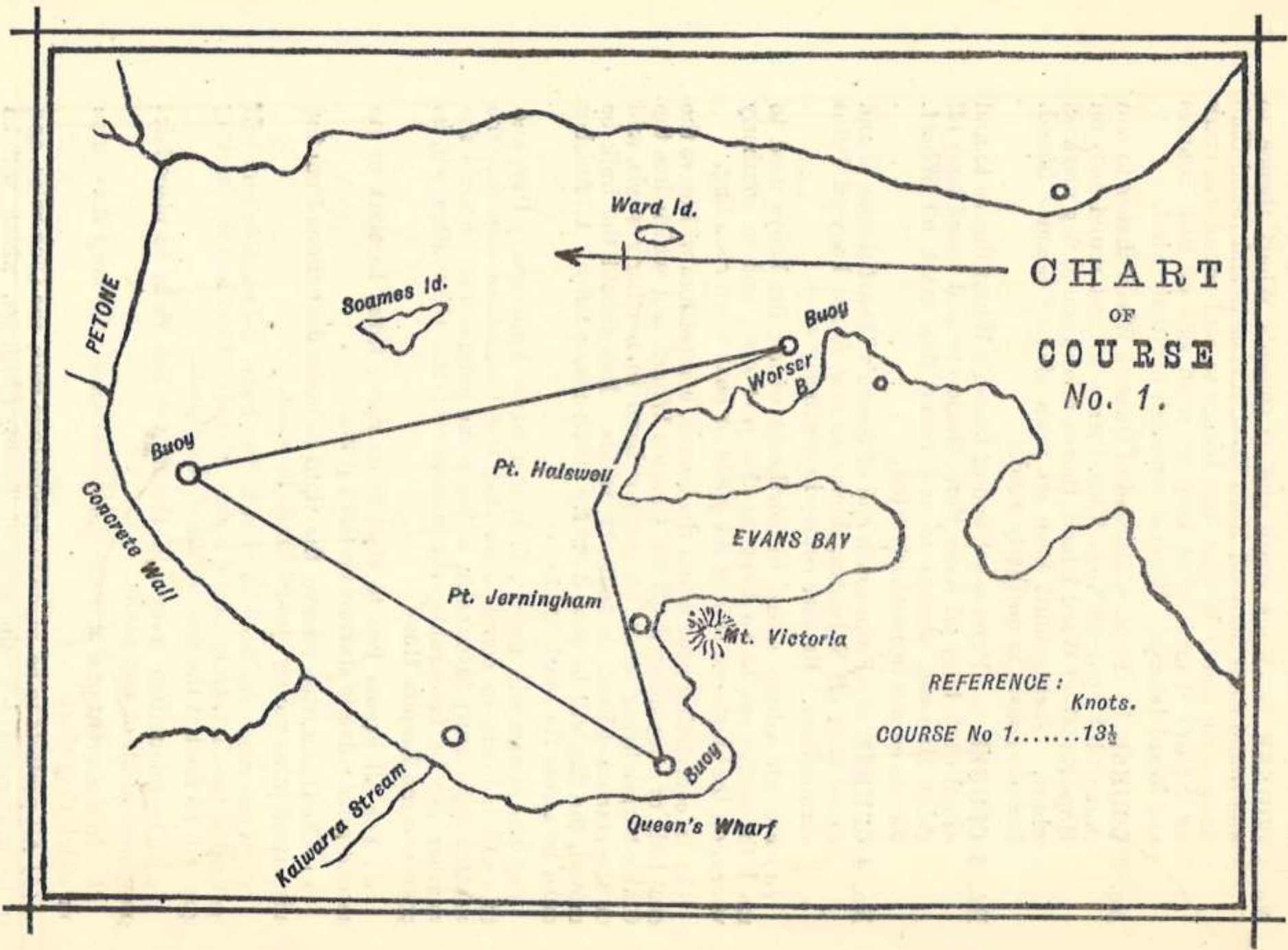

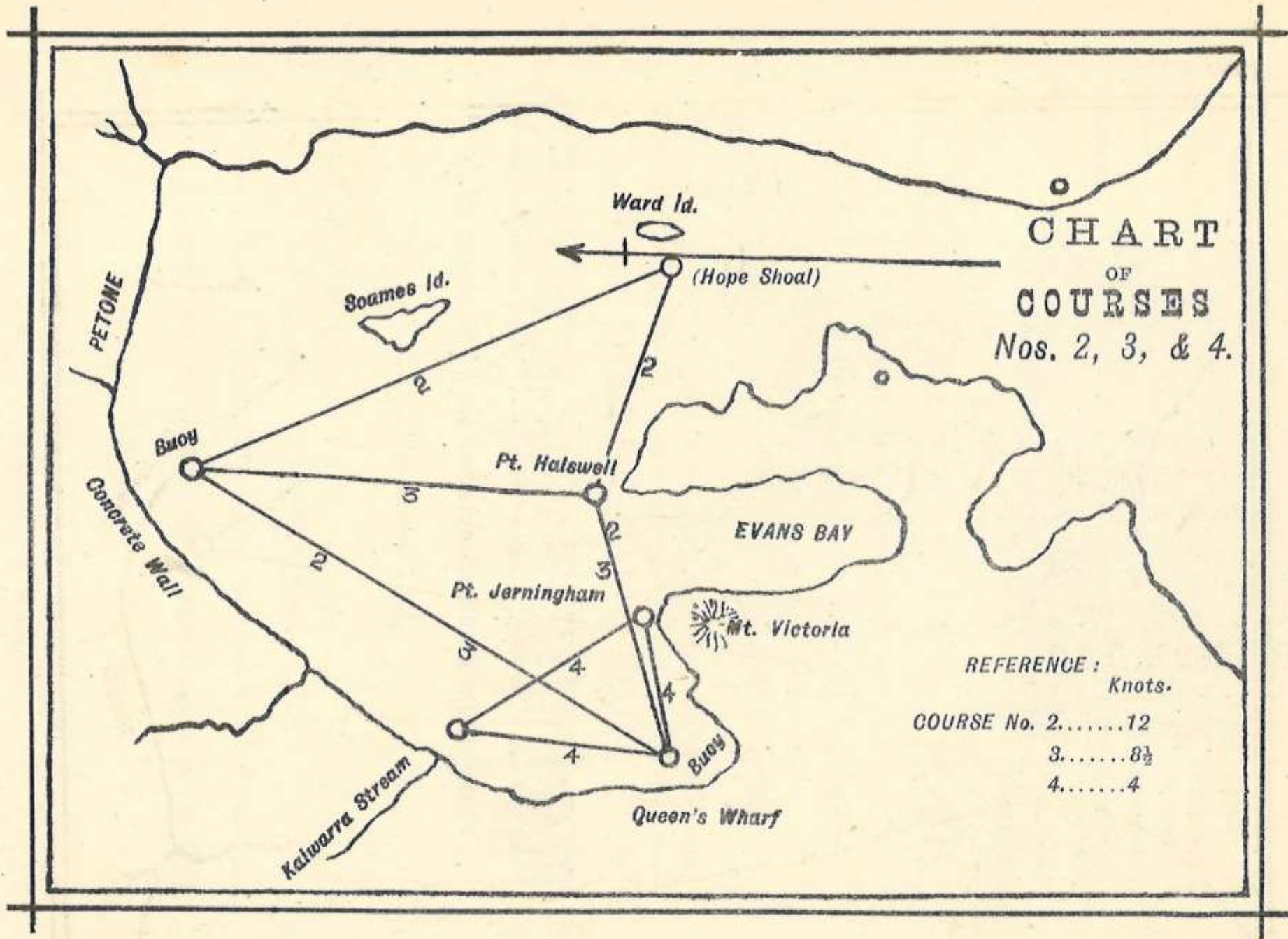
